# A Bill to Abolish College Tuition

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States federal government will abolish tuition fees to students of
3		public colleges, universities, trade schools, and community colleges and increase
4		funding from the Department of Education to state governments for the purpose
5		of distributing necessary funding to the types of institutions listed.
6	SECTION 2.	"Tuition fees" are defined as the cost that higher educational institutions charge
7		for attending and taking classes, not other costs such as, but not limited to, room

9	SECTION 3.	A. The Department of Education and the Department of the Treasury shall be

13		Department of Defense.
14		D. Leftover funding at the end of each fiscal year shall be redistributed into the
15		creation of infrastructure in public colleges, universities, trade schools, and
16		community colleges at the discretion of the Department of Education.
17	SECTION 4.	The provisions of this bill shall take effect on October 1, 2024.
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Reform Driving Education in the United States

1	BE IT ENAC	TED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	Driving education will be a standardized requirement for a driver's license.
3	SECTION 2.	A. "Driving education" is defined as a course or set of courses which covers the
4		operation of all types of vehicles and a standard set of rules and etiquette that
5		should be followed when driving.
6		B. "Standardized requirement" is defined as a nationwide curriculum which every
7		driver must pass in order to obtain a driver's license.
8	SECTION 3.	A. The Department of Transportation (DOT) shall be responsible for designing
9		the curriculum and enforcing the provisions of this bill and will be allocated \$1
10		billion for these purposes.
11		B. Anyone who hasn't successfully completed the course will not be allowed to
12		obtain a valid driver's license. All current drivers are grandfathered in; however,
13		they can be forced to take the course at the discretion of a judge.
14		C. Anyone found driving without a valid driver's license will serve the current
15		punishment as well as an additional \$1000 fee which will go to maintaining this
16		bill.
17		D. Because the DOT implements safety standards from Congress to minimize car
18		accidents this bill falls under federal jurisdiction.
19	SECTION 4.	The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.
20	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Require Mental Health Checks Before the Purchase of a Gun

3		firearm or the acquirement of a gun permit.
4	SECTION 2.	A. A mental health screening is a standard set of questions that a person answers
5		to help a psychologist/psychiatrist check for signs of a mental disorder.
6		B. In order to receive approval on mental health screening citizens shall have to
7		receive a low risk or acceptable risk.
8		C. If applicant disagrees with assessment they can choose to be reassessed by two
9		different independent psychologist/psychiatrist.
10		D. The Department of Justice (D.O.J.) will come up with a plan to refer citizens
11		who tested and received a high-risk assessment to mental help resources.
12	SECTION 3.	A. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives within the D.O.J.
13		shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this bill.
14		B. Without proper mental health screening, permit to purchase shall be denied.
15	SECTION 4.	The provisions of this bill shall take effect two years after passage,
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
